3. DOCUMENTATION, SCRUTINEERING AUDIT & BRIEFINGS

3.1 Documentation:

Will take place at the Race Secretary's Office, situated at the pit end of the administration building
between the hours of:Friday 21 March – 8:00am – 5:00pmSaturday 22 March – 7:30am – 8:30am

3.2 Scrutineering Audit Inspection:

Will take place in the Canterbury Car Club's Scrutineering building between the hours of:Friday 21 March – 1:00pm – 5:00pmSaturday 22 March – 7:30am – 8:30pm

Reminder – Documentation must be completed before ANY track activity, including Friday testing. Scrutineering must be completed before the beginning of your qualifying session.

Competitors must complete documentation first and will be advised if their vehicle has been selected for audit.



3.3 Competitors Briefing:

A written briefing will be issued to all competitors at documentation.

A drivers welcome will also be held at the base of the control tower at 8:45am Saturday. All drivers to attend please.

A separate briefing session will be held for new competitors. In this instance a new competitor is deemed to be a driver competing at one of their first three race events, competing at this circuit for the first time, or racing for the first time in two years.

This will be held in the Wigram room (at base of control tower), at 9:00am Saturday.

4. PADDOCK AREAS & ACCESS:

Pit Setup, no setup or reserving of space before these times: Super Trucks – From 9:00am Wednesday All Other Classes – From 9:00am Thursday

The "Pit Area" or "Paddock" is for competitor's race vehicles and tenders only. All other vehicles are to be parked in the public area parking.

Vehicles without a pit pass sticker will not gain access to the pit area.

Paddock space is limited. Competitors are reminded to occupy as minimum space as possible.

<u>Trailers are to be removed from the pit area and placed in the trailer park in the 'Drag Pits'</u>, past the black shade cloth fence after the Scrutineering Garages and down to the far end of the park. (see pit plan) Please do not park any trailers in the front car park, or behind the scrutineering garages unless it is your allocated service vehicle in which case you must park the tow vehicle in the car park.

Marked lanes in the Pit Area/Paddock must be kept clear at all times.

For competitors with a pit garage, there is 3m directly behind each pit garage (from the garage to the dashed yellow line), which is allocated as part of your garage and not included as the driveway to be kept clear.

The Pit and Paddock areas are **strictly NO SMOKING (incl vaping), NO ALCOHOL** areas. Remember - drivers are responsible for the actions of their crew.

There shall be no barbecues or alcohol in the pit and paddock areas, until after the conclusion of racing each day.

5. PIT LANE (Including Pit Garages)

IMPORTANT – The entire Pit Lane and Pit Garages area must be clear of people at any time Super Trucks are on track.

<u>Pit Lane</u> is a restricted area – only you and your crew are permitted in this area. Children under the age of 16 (other than drivers) are not permitted in this area. Enclosed footwear and appropriate attire to be worn

<u>Pit Wall</u> is restricted to members of your crew wearing the appropriate passes. Any driver or crew member can request a pass from the race secretaries office.

The driver/entrant must ensure that anyone using these passes linked to their entry understands the requirements and safety of crossing the pit lane and being on Pit Wall.

- Appropriate clothing to be worn, especially enclosed footwear
- No persons under 16 years of age
- Be aware of traffic Look Before crossing!
- No sitting/standing on Pit Wall
- Instructions of marshal's and security must be followed
- No one on Pit Wall for race starts

Officials of the event, and MSNZ accredited media, do not require a pass for pit wall.



GENERAL INFORMATION

FUEL Α.

Competitors are reminded that they are required to be familiar with the MotorSport New Zealand Code of Practice - Fuel Handling. It is the Competitors responsibility to meet all requirements whilst at the circuit, in particular but not limited to, compliance with fuel quantities and fire extinguishers. The Clerk of the Course and/or their nominated delegate may carry out random inspections.

Any breach of the MotorSport New Zealand Code of Practice for Motorsport Fuel during the event, may result in exclusion from the event.

Reminder - Bulk fuel, or fuel being stored overnight, can be stored in the official storage container located behind the scrutineering garages.

OFFICIAL NOTICE BOARD Β.

The Official Notice Board will be located outside the Race Secretary's Office.

TESTING AND PRACTICE C.

The circuit will be available for testing on Friday 21st March, this day is included in your entry fee and is part of the official permit for this event. This day will be restricted to entered vehicles and drivers only. See schedule for times.

No Passengers allowed during testing.

D. SECURITY

Overnight security (7.00pm to 7.00am) will be provided from Wednesday to Monday. You are reminded that you are responsible for the security of your and your crews' possessions.

Ε. TRAILERS

All trailers must be parked in the designated trailer parking area located in the drag pits at the far NW end of the property. Approx 300m past scrutineering.

F. **ADVERTISING**

No advertising banners, sales outlets or promotional displays are allowed at the circuit without the express prior approval of The Canterbury Car Club.

VEHICLE TOWING G.

No responsibility will be accepted by The Canterbury Car Club Inc. or the Tow Truck operators, for any damage caused to any race car during any recovery or relocation operation at the meeting. It is the race car owner's responsibility to provide suitable means of towing and/or lifting, at both front and rear of the car, as per the current MSNZ Manual.

PIT VEHICLES Н.

Persons aged under 16 may not use scooters, bicycles, motorcycles, golf carts and similar in the pits at any time.

All other persons operating those modes of transport must do so with extreme care at all times, they must wear suitable safety apparel and not exceed 10kph at any time. Cars have right of way at all times.
