office. It's nice to see the dust settling so we can put all our focus into the Skope Classic.

The Wigram Revival was a real success; entry numbers were very good the racing was fantastic and overall a pretty decent spectator crowd. I had heard a few murmurs around the pits that people thought that crowd numbers were low but, comparing it with the Speed Festival last year, numbers through the gate were very similar. I did notice more people gathered on the pit side of the circuit, which left the banks on the other side looking a little light. It was great to see Continental Rennsport back at a club day, with numbers and support dwindling over recent events, it was great to see a field of sixteen cars take to the track. Well done to the committee members who have stepped up to the plate to inject some enthusiasm back into the class, your efforts really paid off.

As we head towards the Christmas break, entries are flying in for the Skope Classic 2020. It is setting up to be another great race meeting, with the event celebrating it's 30th year and we're also celebrating 50 years of OSCA racing. YOUR SUPER SUMMER OF MOTORSPORT





Running motors in and bedding in brakes etc for Canterbury Car Club Members

With test days becoming so busy, we know that it's not ideal to have cars running motors in and bedding brakes in etc at lower speeds, while others are testing at full race speed. Over the coming months we are going to trial a running in and bedding brakes in the style of a half day, once a month, on the A Track. Due to noise restrictions and safety requirements, **these days will be restricted to speeds of no more than 120km/hr. No heavy acceleration allowed.**

Cost to access the circuit on one of these days will be \$40 for a Canterbury Car Club Member. You will need to wear all your normal safety apparel.

The first two dates that we have scheduled in 2020 for running in motors and bedding in brakes are: Thursday 23rd January 2020 9:00am-12:00pm Tuesday 25th February 2020 9:00am-12:00pm We need to stress that these days are not for full on testing.

To make sure that what you intend to do is going to be compliant, we suggest you phone the office on 03 3496003 the day before. It's so important these days are used correctly. If anyone comes out and attempts to do full on testing, it will most likely mean we have to take a Friday test day away from the rest of the members. As soon as we hit the higher noise limit, that counts as a test day gone, so **these half days run in/brake bedding in days have to be run at a very low noise**.




Results from Round 2



Round 7 - The CCC Santa Lee Xmas Navigation Rally 12th December 2019

Ian says: Well - again - a huge thanks to the Talbot @ Yaldhurst for putting on our Xmas spread. Enjoyed by all! It was also great to see the huge pile of Xmas presents on the table at prizegiving. I hope everyone enjoyed their gift.

Amazing to have 42 out for dinner, and 11 cars competing. It wasn't that long ago (2-3 years?) that we attended an event with 3 cars out!! Thanks to our organisers for putting on a good show. And thanks to Dave Lee's family coming along and participating - a fitting tribute to a great man.

A few things popped up last night. After the event, a few of us had a good conversation - worth sharing here. About the ODO! Well -the discussion last night re-introduced common sense. The purpose of the ODO is to align the organiser's distance measurement with the competitors - so that those who are timekeeping can correct any differences and not lose that last point. The ODO should be about 10% of the total distance, and for a 65 km event (like last night), the ODO was at 6.4km - which is about right. But 6.4 is longer than the 6km limit between checks!

So some of the regular organisers discussing this last night agreed that it was OK to have an ODO longer than 6km, without CHECKS beforehand. The rule book sort of implies that - as any trap pulled would be intricate route finding - which isn't allowed before the ODO anyway. And the use of an ODO CHECK is as close as we are going to get to putting these both together. Allan's use of 6.4KM as the check word was a perfect example of how it should/ could be done.

Another conversation last night was about having a D check code on a board with a number on the bottom. The organiser in this case carefully doesn't do this - and thinks this is sensible. I agree - it just removes any confusion about what is being deleted. Although this crew had plenty of trouble enough with the 2 D's and which CRI were being deleted ourselves!






