



STANDARD SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS PART ONE

DUAL CAR CIRCUIT SPRINT – SUNDAY 23 MAY 2021

1. JURISDICTION

This event is a ClubSport Advanced Dual Car Circuit Sprint Event, promoted by the Canterbury Car Club at Mike Pero Motorsport Park, Ruapuna.

The Meeting will be held under these Supplementary Regulations, the MotorSport NZ National Sporting Code and its Appendices and Schedules particularly Appendix Five, Schedule C being the Standing Regulations for all ClubSport Events and Appendix Two, Schedule A – Driver and Vehicle Safety Requirements, and Schedule AA.

3. EVENT DESCRIPTION:

- 3.1 Each group of up to 14 cars gets an Indian file (warm up lap) to the Start – Cars flagged away in pairs from fastest to slowest.
Pairs min. 5 seconds apart for 2 - 3 laps – Chequered Flag finish with a cool down lap back to the pits.
Minimum: 2 runs per course – 3 courses (Unless prevented by extreme circumstances).
There may be more courses – ie. 4 or 5 (decided on the day and depending on numbers).
For wet events, cars may be run singly with the number of cars limited to the number that can be safely run and accurately timed.

Timing:

Timing by electronic transponder or by manual stopwatch. Cone displacement = 5 seconds and failure to complete the correct course will result in a DNF (no time).

Best run of each course accumulated OR all runs accumulated (announced on the day).

To be deemed a finisher and eligible for points 50% of the courses must have a time recorded.

- 3.2** Classes:
Class 1 0 – 1300cc
Class 2 1301 – 1600cc
Class 3 1601 – 2000cc
Class 4 2001 – 3000cc
Class 5 3001 plus cc
Road-car Class

To be eligible for the road car class, car must have a current WOF and current registration.
Engine CC is free.

Car must still meet all aspects of Schedule A, of the current NZ Motorsport Manual.

No roll-cage or half cage (unless single seater / open top sports car)

Tyres: A treaded tyre will be accepted in accordance with the current Motorsport NZ manual
Appendix two Schedule A, page 242– NO slicks.

You can NOT enter both road-car class and a race cc class in the same entry.

Car must retain road car appearance, at least 2 front seats, interior trim etc.

A race seat and belts are allowed provided the car still has a warrant and registration.

Decision on what is allowed in this class is final upon chief auditor and / or Clerk of the Course.

A competitor can only run a car in the Road-car Class for a maximum of 2 years or 20 events
which ever comes last and a logbook is required after 5 events to continue to stay in the class. If
the car is replaced then the count reverts to 0 (zero).

4. ENTRIES:

- 4.1** Entries should be made through the MotorSport Online system (<https://possum.motorsport.org.nz>).

Alternatively, entries may be submitted manually in 'hard copy' form on the day. All such entries
must be made on the correct form, must be complete in all detail, and accompanied by the
appropriate fees.

Please enter online if possible though to assist with organising.

Organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry in accordance with the prescribed provisions of
the National Sporting Code.

4.2 Opening and Closing Dates:

Entries open with the publication of these regulations and close at 10:00am on the day.

4.3 Entry Fees:

The Entry fee for this event is \$85, or \$65 for CCC Junior members, including GST per competitor.

Payment can be made pre event if accompanying an entry through the MotorSport Online system.
Payment must be completed early enough to clear in the Club account by Friday before the event.

5. COMPETITOR REQUIREMENTS and UNDERSTANDING:

5.1 Licence Requirements:

All drivers must hold as a minimum an M Grade Competition Licence and current membership
with a member club.

If the Entrant is other than a driver, an Entrants licence in the name of the Entrant is required.

5.2 **Competitor Understanding:**

In submitting the entry competitors (Entrant and Drivers) are deemed to fully understand the MotorSport NZ National Sporting Code and its relevant Appendices and Schedules. In particular:

- The National Sporting Code Articles pertaining to protests and competitors obligations, and
- Appendix Five, Schedule C.

5.3 All competitors shall wear safety apparel in compliance with Appendix Two, Schedule A. Approved helmet and/or overalls can be hired by contacting the CCC Office **before** the weekend of the event.

6. **ELIGIBLE VEHICLES**

6.1 **Compliance:** All vehicles shall comply with Appendix Five Schedule C and Appendix Two Schedule A, or Schedule AA of the current MotorSport Manual unless stated otherwise in these supplementary regulations.

7. **DOCUMENTATION & SCRUTINEERING AUDIT INSPECTION**

7.1 **Documentation:** Will take place in the Race Secretaries office from 8:30am to 10:00am.

7.2 **Scrutineering Audit Inspection:** Will take place in the CCC Scrutineering Garages from 8:30am to 10:00am.
Competitors will be advised at documentation if their vehicle has been selected for audit.

7.3 **Drivers' Briefing:** This will be held at on the paved area under the control tower at 10:15am. Attendance by all drivers is compulsory – a roll call will be taken and failure to attend will result in a penalty.

8. **POSTPONEMENT CANCELLATION ABANDONMENT & ORGANISERS' RIGHTS:**

8.1 Pursuant to national Sporting Code Article 13, the organisers advise that if less than 15 entries are received by the entry closing date the meeting may be postponed or cancelled.

9. **OFFICIAL BULLETINS**

9.1 Official Bulletins may be issued in accordance with the provisions of the National Sporting Code.

10. **GENERAL INFORMATION**

10.1 **Passengers:** May only be carried in accordance with Appendix Five, Schedule C Article 6.2.

10.2 Alcohol is not permitted to be consumed by any competitor or their crew at the event before or during the day's competition.

10.3 **Noise Limit - Maximum Permitted Noise Level:**

The maximum permitted noise level is 95db(A). Appendix 2 (Part One) Schedule A, 3.8 Noise levels NZ MotorSport Manual No. 36. It is the policy of the Canterbury Car Club Inc through its Raceway Noise Management Plan to Black Flag off the circuit any competition vehicle exceeding this level. These vehicles may not resume competition until such time as repairs are carried out to the satisfaction of the appropriate official. Any further breach of the noise level will result in the competition vehicle being penalised further and excluded from the Meeting.

The Clerk of Course will be Judge of Fact in these matters and the Raceway Noise Management Plan will take priority over these Supplementary Regulations and the Series Articles. The running of competition engines in the pits before 9.00am and after 6.00pm, must be done with consideration to our neighbours and can only be done at low revs. Anyone deemed to be creating excessive noise during this time period, may be excluded from the Meeting.

10.4 Activity Outside Of The Circuit:

It is the policy of The Canterbury Car Club Inc. to exclude from the meeting, any competitor driving a non road legal vehicle to or from the circuit, or any entered vehicle and competitor driving outside of the Pit Paddock or the Race Circuit proper in any form of "test activity" once the Meeting has commenced.

10.5 Pit Wall:

The Pit Wall will be **closed** for the entire event. The only exception to this is as cars are forming up on the grid one crew member may stand at pit wall to assist with lining up in grid spaces. Pit wall must be clear for the race start procedure to commence.

10.6 Health and Safety:

By entering this event, you agree that you and everyone on your team, will meet your obligations under the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015.

10.7 Pit Vehicles

Any pit vehicles being ridden/driven in the pits (motorcycles, bicycles etc) must have the appropriate PPE for that vehicle e.g. helmets etc.

10.8 Children and Animals:

Children in the enclosed pit and paddock areas must be under parental control at all times. Children are prohibited from riding pit bikes, bicycles, scooters or using roller blades in these areas. Children under the age of 16 are not permitted in the pit garages or pit lane complex.

Animals of any kind are **NOT** permitted within the confines of the Park during this race meeting.
